PRINCE OF PEACE ALUM REACHES FOR THE STARS



Prince of Peace Catholic School is a small school-no one will dispute that fact. Actually, the "smallness" of the school is one of the most attractive features of the school if you speak to parents and students. Small means more individualized attention and more opportunities for academic growth. However, the seeds cultivated in the small halls of a small school can grow and develop into big things. Just ask Josh and Hanni (Ecker) Lawrence.

Josh graduated from Prince of

Peace College Preparatory in 2008, and is the son of Dave and Cathy (Trimble) Lawrence, MSCA 1968. Josh attended all twelve years at Prince of Peace and in 2007, met Hanni in those same small halls, when she came to the United States from Vienna, Austria, as a sophomore exchange student. While here for a semester, Hanni lived with her host family, Denise and Mark Mangin. Hanni returned to Austria and graduated in 2008 at Goethegymnasium.

After high school, Josh attended Iowa State University and studied aerospace engineering graduating in 2012. While in college, Josh participated in an internship at Rockwell Collins, in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and then with RUAG Space in Vienna. After graduation, he took a job with Lockheed Martin in the Washington, DC, area operating satellites. Big city life was not for Josh so in 2014, he accepted a new position with Lockheed in Colorado and there was able to begin and complete his Master's in Engineering Management at the University of Colorado in 2017. Today, Josh is an orbital analyst for the Space Based Infrared System (SBIRS) which is a U.S. Air Force program consisting of a constellation of satellites which provide infrared surveillance used to detect missile launches. Josh states that "my career highlights have thus far been working the launch of 2 new SBIRS satellites. I am part of a small team that is responsible for maneuvering the satellites from where the rocket 'dropped' us off to where our final orbit is."

Hanni has been equally busy post high school. Her creative side compelled her to apply to "die Graphische" in Vienna and obtained her degree in Graphic and Communication Design. She states that she enjoyed the creative aspect of her studies, but along the way, she developed an interest in the business component as well. She continued her education and obtained a bachelor's degree in Marketing and Sales from FH Wien (Vienna) in 2015. While still in school, she was employed as a graphic designer for Contacts Advertising Agency and later for Wunderman, a digital marketing agency. as an account manager. Upon graduation in 2015, she permanently moved to the United States. Presently Hanni is the marketing manager at Verdad Real Estate in Denver where she works with clients such as Starbucks, 7-Eleven, and Burger King "developing effective

online and offline strategy to win new clients and improve existing client relationships."

Josh and Hanni spent a relatively short time together at Prince of Peace that one semester that she attended. It was during that time that they began dating and continued their relationship over the span of nine years until marrying in August of 2016. Fortunately during those years, they were able to spend some school vacations together. Their relationship certainly stood the test of time and distance!

As they both reflect on their high school and college years, they single out their families as their primary cheerleaders. They give much credit to the faculty, students, and entire Prince of Peace community in shaping them into the people they are today. Josh reports his history classes were among his favorites while Hanni says her small Algebra 2 class had a personal touch. Hanni reflects that her semester at Prince of Peace was "such a great experience for me" as she felt very welcome at the school. As with most high school students, the social aspect of that precious half hour of lunch was where Josh and Hanni were able to cultivate their relationship and get to know each other. They both remember "non-stop" laughter with friends during that very important break in the day.

As they have moved on past high school and college days, they have remained in contact with some of their Clinton friends. They see these friends at bachelor parties, weddings, and return trips to Clinton for holidays. Josh is happy to report that he remains great friends with another Denver resident and 2008 graduate, Breanne Determan, daughter of Ken and Lynne (Horst) Determan.

Free time in Colorado allows Josh and Hanni time for hiking in the summer and skiing in the winter. Since they both enjoy travel, long weekends with flights and road trips to new destinations are at the top of their list.

Josh and Hanni are proof that the individualized and personal approach to education that is paramount to a small Catholic school education is a recipe for success. As they recap their journey from high school to college to careers, they offer the following advice to new and older alumni: "Approach the years after graduation with a learning and growth mindset. 

Prince of Peace Catholic School is currently exploring the idea of "going solar" on the school building and the gymnasium. We are working with Eagle Point Solar based out of Dubuque, lowa: www.eaglepointsolar.com.

Eagle Point Solar has provided us with preliminary information detailing how a rooftop solar installation can reduce the amount of electric power we are currently buying from Alliant Energy by 90%, which will translate into significant savings. In fact, over a 25 year period, we can save an average of \$44,210.00 annually or over \$1,105,000.00 on energy costs!

ALUMNI HELP PUT A NEW FLOOR ON CENTRAL CATHOLIC AUDITORIUM (CCA) A NEW NAME WILL FOLLOW - JOE O'DONNELL SPORTS CENTER

Our school gym, Central Catholic Auditorium (CCA), was built and dedicated in 1978. Six years ago, an upgrade and renovation process began and the last major project to complete is the resurfacing of the floor. Earlier projects included new bleachers, concession stand renovations, roof replacement and boiler system upgrades. 


The existing floor has served us well. Hundreds of thousands of hours of practices and games have been played on this floor. Our athletes" dreams of state level competition

This facelift consists of fixing a crack that has developed, running the length of the court and laying a new synthetic floor over the existing floor. Years and years of future Irish athletes will proudly represent our school on the new floor as those who have in the past.

The current and final project has been funded through donations from Clinton Catholic Schools' Alumni and friends. Major donor, Michael O'Donnell (SMHS 1965) was awarded naming rights. Central Catholic Auditorium will now be named Joe O'Donnell Sports Center. Michael chose to honor his brother, Joe (SMHS 1964), to recognize Joe's devotion and commitment to the school and it's athletic programs for the last 50 years.
