MARK VULICH—AT THE HELM OF CLINTON GOVERNMENT

Clinton businessman, Mark Vulich, is a true-blue native son of Clinton, Iowa. Mark is a member of the St. Mary's High School class of 1975 and has always called Clinton his home. As a high school student in the early to mid 1970s, Mark had no idea that one day he would be the mayor of the city he called home. He has many fond memories of his grade school years at Sacred Heart School and the memories of the great 1975 Class 1A basketball championship game when St. Mary's beat Grundy Center 71-63.

After graduation, Mark continued his education at Mt. St. Clare College where he received his Associate of Arts degree in 1977. From there he continued his education for 2 more years at the Indiana College of Mortuary Science in Indianapolis where he earned his AMS degree. Upon returning to Clinton, he worked at the family business started in 1907 by his grandfather, Stephen Delaney, Sr. Mark ran the business, Delaney-Vulich Funeral Home, from 1978 until his "retirement" in 2002. Within that span of time from graduation to retirement, Mark married Connie (Breen) Vulich and also opened two businesses in Clinton. Mark continues to operate Midwest Computer & Consulting which opened in 1981.

As a downtown businessman, Mark had the opportunity to participate at the committee level in many organizations. He was part of the Clinton Downtown Partnership board of directors which dealt with ongoing parking issues in the downtown area. His involvement in the Clinton Kiwanis Club as the past charter treasurer, board member and president gave him ample opportunities to work with community members in solving problems and improving the quality of life in his hometown. Mark admits that he would watch the televised broadcasts of the Clinton city council meetings and it was then that the bug to be involved at a deeper level was born. Mark says, "For years, I had wanted to become involved in the city. I was fascinated by city government." When a council-at-large position opened in 2006 due to a resignation, Mark tossed his hat in the ring as a candidate, Clinton's mayor at that time was LaMetta Wynn and after interviews with her and the current council, Mark assumed the remaining term. In 2007, Mark ran for the Council-at-Large position and won. He

remained in that position until announcing his candidacy for mayor in the fall of 2011. In November 2011, his dream became a reality when he won the mayoral election.

Mark admits that the city of Clinton has its fair share of economic challenges but is quick to note that all cities have challenges with financial issues. He says the biggest challenge he and the city council have today is "trying to find enough money to run the city."

Mark is thrilled to have been in of-



fice during the development of the Lincolnway Rail and Air Park and that two businesses have created over 80 jobs there. Some of the best news lately has been the announcement and opening of the Federal Penitentiary in Thomson, Illinois. The prison is projected to hire 1000 employees as it reaches its maximum staffing needs.

Another exciting piece of news for the city of Clinton is that Mark has recently been elected as the lowa representative and treasurer of the "Mississippi River Cities and Towns Initiative" which was started by the Walton Foundation. This group is made up of representatives of the 10 states and 120 cities that have the Mississippi River running along their banks. Only 67 of the 120 cities along the river are active members of this initiative which was established to advance tourism, develop plans for eco-system preservation, and to upgrade the lock and dam system

His mayoral duties and meetings keep Mark extremely busy. He and Connie take time to do some traveling in the U.S. and one of his "bucket list" items is to travel to the western U.S. by Amtrak. For now, his eyes are on the 2015 city election that will be held this November. Mark says, "Clinton is not a bad place to live. My hope is to make it a better place for everyone." With his positive attitude, Mark Vulich is sure to succeed.

ULLAINEE WAREHAM 1912-2015

In the Fall 2012 edition of "The Grapevine" we featured Ullainee (Pitts) Wareham's Ullainee was the oldest known story. alumni of our Clinton Catholic Schools and on January 11, 2015, she passed away at the age of 102. Ullainee was born on April 10, 1912, and her St. Mary's High School class of 1930 was the first to use the "new" high school building located on 8th Ave. South. Ullainee married Lyman Wareham in 1936 and raised three sons all of whom graduated from St. Mary's. James graduated in 1957, John in 1959, and Jerry in 1966. Ullainee and Lyman were partners in the Milo John Company which operated Rexall Drug Stores. Ullainee was very active at St. Mary's Church and School as well as in the community. In 1970, she and her husband retired to Arizona and returned to

Davenport in 1979. Lyman passed away in 1985. Ullainee remained in Davenport until moving to Chagrin Falls, Ohio, to be closer to her son and family. In 2006, the Lyman and Ullainee Wareham Scholarship was established in the Prince of Peace Catholic School Foundation. The initial contribution came from funds donated on Ullainee's 80th birthday. The purpose of the fund is to help young people to realize their goals and hopefully inspire generosity in others.


