NANCY PEART: 15 YEARS OF SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP

When the doors opened for the first day of classes of the new school year this August 14th, the students. faculty, staff, and parents were greeted by the smiling face of Nancy Peart as she began her 15th year as Prin-

cipal of Prince of Peace Catholic School. Nancy Peart, lifetime member of the parish, attended St. Boniface Grade School and graduated from St. Mary's High School in 1969. In the mid-1980s, Nancy was appointed by the bishop to a commission that had the goal of consolidating the Clinton Catholic schools into a single system. With the schools consolidated, Nancy was elected school board president and served in that capacity for six years. She is quick to note that her family was completely supportive of her work because they wanted a strong Catholic school for their young family to attend. Nancy felt blessed to be hired by the school first as an exploratory Spanish teacher and then later as a high school English teacher.

While still teaching at the high school level and raising her young family, Nancy states that she felt the Lord was calling her to do something more. It was at that time she made the commitment to go back to school to obtain the necessary licensure to be a school principal. Our parish school had witnessed the turnover of principals over the years and Nancy realized this wasn't the best scenario if the school was going to prosper. In May 2000, an interview committee was formed to find a principal for the parish school. After interviewing candidates for the position, Nancy was appointed as the new principal of the school and began a new chapter in her life.

Nancy's position as the principal of a pre-Kindergarten through high school system is unique in the Davenport Diocese as she is the only person to serve in such a capacity. Former Prince of Peace School vice-principal, and now St. Joseph Catholic School – DeWitt principal Sharon Roling comments, "At the diocesan level, Nancy's wisdom as a prekindergarten through high school principal is sought after by others."

Nancy's passion for Catholic education is evident in her every action. She lives the school's mission statement in her daily life as she promotes "Gospel values and Catholic tradition in the context of a changing world." Current school board president Joel Atkinson says, "Nancy always has the best interest of the children and the school when making decisions" and "has a strong commitment to making sure Catholic education continues at Prince of

Peace Parish." While passionately committed to a rigorous, high quality, faith-based, and service oriented education of our young people today, Nancy has been known to say that her primary goal for the students is to "get them to heaven and not to Harvard" thereby stressing the primary importance of faith in today's world.

Nancy is an approachable leader. She takes time to meet with students, faculty, staff, and parents regarding their concerns. She is present at school Masses and religious ceremonies, school events, dances, games, concerts, and performances, all while juggling many after-hour meetings with different parish and school committees. School parents Steve and Cathy Eggers comment that Nancy has a "sense of ownership for all the various aspects of operating a school" and "provides parents with a level of partnership in the education of their children."

Nancy Peart is a realistic person who knows that our parish Catholic school and those throughout the nation face many challenges. She notes that the three biggest challenges today are hiring and retaining excellent teachers, finances, and enrollment. Prince of Peace Catholic School is blessed to have many teachers who have dedicated their lives to Catholic education. Nancy notes that the goal of Catholic schools is to keep tuition affordable for everyone and to move toward a just wage for faculty and staff all while keeping the bills paid. Nancy states, "We need our parish students and students from the community to attend our school." She notes that our Prince of Peace parishioners and priests have been completely supportive of the mission to pass the faith on to our young people through the school. Families who make the financial sacrifices necessary to have their children attend our parish school should be commended. They are dedicated to ensuring "their children have an education rooted and grounded in Gospel values in the Catholic tradition."

Nancy notes that she is humbled by the rewards her job offers. She understands that through her role as principal of Prince

Catholic Peace School she is "doing important work in passing on our faith to the next generation." We, as alumni and Friends of Catholic education, are asked to keep Prince of Peace Catho-School and all Catholic schools in our prayers as the school continues the work of Jesus Christ in making disciples of all people. Congratulations, Mrs. Peart!





BOB MULHOLLAND RECEIVES INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER AWARD







REMAINS OF SMHS GRADUATE AND WWII FLYER RETURNED

Louis T. Longman was born on January 23, 1918, in Murdock. MN, and moved to Clinton to live with family as a child. An all-state honorable mention for football, Louis graduated from St. Mary's High School in 1936.

In 1942, he answered the call to serve our country when he enlisted in the Army and was assigned to the 433rd Fighter Squadron of the 475th Fighter Group in the 5th Air Force. Longman was a fighter escort for a bombing in New Guinea on April 16, 1944. Participants in this mission encountered bad weather and low fuel supplies and consequently 31 aircraft and 53 pilots and crewmen were lost in what would become known as "Black Sunday." Lt. Longman was declared dead by the U.S. Army on February 27, 1946.

In 2005, local villagers turned remains and a .45 pistol over to U.S. officials. On November 1, 2013, the remains were positively identify as those of Lt. Louis Longman.

On April 12, 2014, Lt. Longman was honored with a Memorial service and was laid to rest at the Rock Island National Cemetery on Arsenal Island with full military honors provided by the Iowa National Guard. God bless you for your service to our country, Louis. Eternal rest, grant unto him, O Lord.


