MEMORIES FROM THE SMHS CLASS OF 1941

We are always interested in what you, the readers of The Grapevine, are interested in reading. We will gladly take suggestions for articles for this front page feature. Don Jacobs (SMHS 1975) offered that his uncle, Francis Jacobs (SMHS 1941) might be a great candidate for this feature.

Francis is an ideal example of a life well lived during and after his years of education in the Clinton Catholic schools. Francis is a proud member of the St. Mary's Class of 1941 which consisted of fourteen boys and twelve girls. Francis is the son of Harry and Mary Jacobs and was the fifth child of ten. His years at St. Mary's Grade School and High School were busy with school work, extra-curricular activities, and a job. Francis reflects that as a high school student his favorite classes were bookkeeping, English, Latin, and math. His love of bookkeeping sparked his interest so much that his lifetime career with the Internal Revenue Service can be traced back to his early days as a teenager. Francis comments that his favorite teacher, Sr. Mary Christiana, BVM, his bookkeeping teacher, "was very thoughtful of her students."

As with all students, there are classes that are not as appealing as that one class or subject that could hold your interest for the entire day. For Francis, his freshman year of Ancient History taught by Sr. Mildredeen was that class for him. He remarks that he believes he was too young to appreciate the dry subject matter but that Sister was a very good teacher.

Outside of the classroom, Francis was a busy young man as he participated in choral club, the senior play, Sodality, football, where he lettered as a senior, scouts, and basketball. His family attended St. Mary's Church where Francis was an altar boy as well. During his high school years, he worked briefly for a hardware store and then secured a 7 day a week job with Crystal Dairy where his brother Richard was the bookkeeper and main route manager. Francis washed bottles and cans for \$1.00 a day.

After high school, Francis worked for the railroad as a boilermaker apprentice before serving his country in the United States Navy from May 1943 until August 1946. Francis was an Aerial Navigator and served in Guam and Japan. During his time with the Navy, he was stationed in Memphis, Tennessee, where in 1944 he met his future wife, Catherine Gattuso. After his discharge from the service, Francis was able to graduate from St. Ambrose College in Davenport, lowa, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business in 1950.

That year was important for another reason as Francis and Catherine married in Memphis on June 17, 1950. His employment with the IRS in Davenport began in 1949 so the newlyweds returned to the Davenport area until 1959. Francis' career allowed him to acquire the position of Collections

Officer and as a Field Agent/Appeasement Officer. St. Paul, Minnesota, was the next destination for the Jacobs family and where they lived from 1959 on. In 1982, Francis retired from the IRS and acquired part-time employment as an administrator for the Leo C. Byrne Residence for retired priests in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. He held this position until July 1999.

Francis' and Catherine's marriage held many blessings as they celebrated 65+ years of marriage. Their legacy lives on with their eight children (five boys and three girls), 18 grandchildren, and 17 great grandchildren. During their retirement years, the Jacobs' enjoyed square dancing and line dancing as well as RV travel to the lower 48 states and Canada. Winters were spent in the Tampa area. Francis points out that he and his wife had the joy of celebrating their 90th birthdays together in Red Wing, Minnesota, with family and friends in attendance from eight states. Sadly Catherine passed away in August 2015.

Today, Francis continues to live an active life at the Marian Center of St. Paul Cerenity. He counts his large family as a blessing in his life. As he reflects on his four years at St. Mary's High School, Francis notes that his childhood pastor, Msgr. Galligan (St. Mary's Parish), "demonstrated a devotion and love to St. Joseph which I have tried to emulate in all of my life." He fondly remembers his very best friends who included Tom Dolan, Bob Cunningham, Bill Noonan, Jack McAndrews, Bud McConnell, and Jack Leonard.

When asked to reflect on his Catholic education, Francis summed up his experience by saying that 16 years

of Catholic education is irreplaceable!" He continues to say, "(I have) no golden words but the value of perseverance, faith, and trust are mine."



PRINCE OF PEACE CATHOLIC SCHOOL EARNS HIGH RANKING AMONG IOWA HIGH SCHOOLS

In January 2017, Prince of Peace Catholic School was named one of the top ten Catholic schools in the state of Iowa by Niche's rankings. Niche analyzes data and public reviews to produce rankings, report cards and profiles of K-12 educational institutions. Prince of Peace was ranked number six among Iowa Catholic high schools and as the number nine among Iowa private high schools. Eighteen Catholic schools and twenty-seven private schools were examined. The positive rating came from data collected about ACT/SAT scores and was weighted the heaviest at 30%. Other factors analyzed included percentage of students heading to college, diversity, and parent and student survey results. Karen Witt, Prince of Peace Development Director, shares, "Anytime you can be recognized in a ranking in the top ten shows we're going in the right direction. It's a nice honor especially since part of the rankings is feedback from parents and students.



BUILDING BRIDGES



Gerry comments, "One of the reasons I became the varsity coach was to bring some stability to the program." Stability to Irish athletics has been achieved. Gerry, an employee in the ship-

ping department of Clysar, LLC, (formally DuPont), reached a milestone of his own by coaching his 200th win at the February 21, 2017, Class 1A District 8 semi-final game against Calamus/Wheatland with a score of 66-55. Gerry was also named Coach of the Year for the Tri-Rivers Conference, East Division. Gerry's record as coach for Mater Dei/Prince of Peace is 200-163. His teams have performed exceptionally well and this season is no exception. Gerry's coaching took teams to lowa sub-state play in 2009 and 2011. 
