Prince of Peace Welcomes Director of Advancement

pon the retirement of Karen Witt (SMHS '76), longtime Development

Director, Prince of Peace Catholic School had big shoes to fill. The Clinton Catholic School

community is very thankful to Karen for over a

decade of service to her alma mater and the Prince of Peace Catholic School Foundation.

Prince of Peace Catholic School alumnus Nate Vander Bleek (POPCS '14) has been chosen to take over. The position, renamed to the Director of Advancement, focuses on alumni relations and fundraising for both the school and the Foundation.

Vander Bleek is the son of Bart and Maureen (Frett, SMHS '79) Vander Bleek. Nate attended Prince of Peace from preschool through his senior year. After high school, Vander attended and graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, majoring in Integrated Marketing. During college he also worked for the University of Wisconsin-Platteville Alumni Foundation.

"I am very happy to get back to where I started," Vander Bleek says. "There's something very poetic about going full circle in life. I have always loved my alma mater and am very eager to help in a more hands-on way."

During high school, Vander Bleek participated in drama, speech, quiz bowl, band, chorus, student council, and National Honor Society. He is also an Eagle Scout.

"There is no doubt in my mind that my education at Prince of Peace prepared me for college and beyond," Vander Bleek says. "Both inside and outside of the classroom, I found that I was more ready for that transition than most of my peers."

Vander Bleek says that he attributes much of his success to his high school teachers. Mrs. Kathy Andrews and Mr. Matt Hovey were especially impactful. "They pushed me to truly own the things that I am passionate about and use that motivation to propel myself toward my goals."

Outside of his role as Director of Advancement, Vander Bleek also serves as the Prince of Peace Quiz Bowl coach, speech coach, and as the public address announcer at varsity basketball

Alumnus Leads Red Ravens to National Title

ay Herkelman (MDHS '81), is a Clinton Catholic School Alum, NJCAA Hall of Famer, and the winningest men's basketball coach in NJCAA Region 6 history. But this year he added one more mark to his résumé: national champion.

Since 1995, Herkelman has been the men's head basketball coach at Coffeyville Community College in Coffeyville, Kansas. On April 24, 2021, his Red Ravens defeated Crowley County Community College to become NJCAA National Champions. The Red Ravens were ranked in the top ten for the entire season and finished with a record of 27-3.

Coach Herkelman now has a record of 661-188 in his coaching career, and he was inducted into the *Herkelman, continued on p. 5*

Fifty Years Ago... Irish Blast Indians For Title, 40-0

First Unbeaten Season Mary's Irish defeated the Savanna Indians In St. Mary's History



On Friday, November 5, 1971, the St. to capture the Hilltoppers' first and only undefeated football season.

Under the leadership of head coach Bob Josten (SMHS '66), the Irish rolled a 6-0-1 record in the Illowa Conference, snapping a six year streak of Illowa titles by the Comets of Sterling Newman. The Irish were led by several seniors, including quarterback Randy Trine's seven passing touchdowns, Gary Jungen's ten rushing touchdowns, and Jim Peart's eight rushing touchdowns. The '71 Irish football team will be remembered for their dominant play, beating their opponents by an average of over 17 points per game.

Jack Merdian 1935-2021

Jack L. Merdian passed away at age 86 on September 9, 2021. He taught history and coached basketball at St. Mary's High School from 1959 to 1971. While at St. Mary's, he coached many great student-athletes including the 1965 boys' basketball team, which finished as Iowa State Runner-Up. At the time, there was only one class tournament for

boys' basketball.

"Coach was a kind but tough coach," says Gary Harstick (SMHS '65). "He helped us believe that we could play tough and win no matter the opponent. We gave our all for him and for St Mary's High School. My senior year, 1965, was a magical year, along with senior teammates Terry Gertson, Jim "Vinnie" Dalton, Dave Hilgendorf, and our now departed teammates Larry Brennan, Larry McMahon and Tom Quinn."

Coach Merdian will forever be remembered by the Clinton Catholic School Community as a valuable member of the school family and we thank him for his contributions to its students. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen. **
