PRINCE OF PEACE COLLEGE PREP GRAD-MATTHEW PITTMAN-CELEBRATES SMALL SCHOOL EXPERIENCE



We can often wonder what graduates take away with them as they leave the halls of any school. Even if they have the same classes, same teachers, same sports team, same play practice with the same people, their experiences and the feelings that they have about their school will be as individual as they are.

When Matt Pittman graduated from Prince of Peace College Prepara-

tory in 2001, he had appeared to have had a normal high school experience. However, it's probably safe to assume that very few of his middle school classmates knew that Matt was already thinking of a medical career. Matt writes that his decision to enter the medical profession came from listening to the work experiences of his mother, Ann (Witt) Pittman, SMHS 1978, who was and still is a nurse.

After high school graduation, Matt attended Loyola University in Chicago where he majored in biology and minored in chemistry. After Loyola, he attended Georgetown University School of Medicine in Washington, D.C. While at Georgetown, Matt determined that surgery was his chosen specialty and he returned to Loyola for his general surgery residency. He then completed a fellowship at Ohio State University in Minimally Invasive and Bariatric surgery. Matt attributes his choice of the medical profession to his high school science teacher, Sr. Martha Ryder, BVM, who "helped ignite my love of science and discovery."

Matt joined Northwestern Medicine in August 2015 to start a Bariatric Surgery program at Delnor Hospital in Geneva, IL. Matt currently serves as the Director of the Center for Weight Loss and Metabolic Surgery at Delnor Hospital. Matt acknowledges that his principal (and current school principal) Mrs. Nancy (McDonnell) Peart, SMHS 1969, taught him what "levelheaded leadership should look like." Matt always knew he was not the right person to have a desk job. The love of science was in his blood and he had a strong desire to serve others. He says, "Medicine perfectly encompassed those career goals for me, making it a natural fit." His original plan did not include specializing in surgery. He admits that he was hoping for a medical career "with much better hours."

Despite the challenges of the course work, the rigor and stress of medical school, and the personal toll that becoming a surgeon demands, Matt also credits a strong support group of family and friends to his success. While missing holiday and family events wasn't easy, his closest friends and family members helped his dream become a reality.

While Matt was a student at Mater Dei/Prince of Peace College Prep, he participated in many extra-curricular activities. He reminisces about how much he enjoyed the fun and preparations for Homecoming as well as being a team member on the soccer and cross-country teams. Matt shares kind words about his experience in the high school drama department. He relates, "Mr. Jankowski helped me to find my voice and to stand in front of crowds without fear." Matt credits the opportunities that a small school provides with his success. He states, "The beauty of being in a small, tight knit school is that you truly feel a part of something bigger than just attending high school."

During his free time, Matt enjoys being active and outdoors as much as possible. He loves to run, ski, hike, and get out on the water whenever possible. Travel is another love and he enjoys the chance to explore and experience new cultures and new places.

Matt has tried to keep in touch with his classmates and enjoys seeing a few that live in the Chicago area. He knows that careers and life, in general, keep people busy so meeting up with familiar faces in a big city is a real joy.

Above all, Matt loves his family. His choice to live in the Chicago area affords him the opportunity to be closer to his parents, who he refers to as "amazing" and his "three incredible sisters."

It is evident that family is of primary importance to Dr. Matthew Pittman. His experiences growing up at his own home and at our small school clearly impacted his life and career. His words, "it is really the feeling of being a small family that I will cherish the most" is in the hearts of all of us who passed through the halls of one of our Clinton Catholic Schools.

OLA ALUMNA GOING STRONG AT 98 YEARS OLD

Not too many people have been alive for 17 different presidential terms in the White House. Marie (Frett) Salutz-Conery, 98, (OLA 1936) just may be our most-senior alumni hailing from our Clinton Catholic Schools. Marie was born in 1918 and was the oldest of thirteen children of August and Veronica (Reuter) Frett. While at OLA, Marie recalls that she was a serious student who found that mathematics and grammar were her favorite classes. While tending to her studies, Marie also worked as a housekeeper for Leroy and Bernadette Mousel who were the owners of the Beez-Mousel clothing store in Lyons.

Following her graduation in 1936, Marie worked for Curtis Company. By early 1942, she had met her future husband, Leo Salutz, who left to serve his country in World War II. Marie moved to Washington D.C. and worked at the Naval Research Laboratory. Later she moved to Miami and worked for Pan Am Airways as a typist. Marie and Leo married at St. Irenaeus Church in April 1945, After their wedding, Leo was still in the United States Army Air Force and was stationed in Louisville, KY, at Bowman Airfield. Marie was a civilian employee there and actually wrote up the papers for her husband's discharge.

The Salutz's would settle in Clinton and would eventually have six children. Marie remembers that she was very involved in parish and school activities including Parent's Guild, PTA, the Altar and Rosary Society and numerous other

Marie has been a matriarch in the Frett family and has always kept many details about family and friends sharp in her mind. She wanted to let readers know that one of her classmates from the OLA class of 1936, Alice (Hanafan) Dever is still living and will SOON be 98! Marie, however, already celebrated that birthday and is gearing up for #99!




With determination and that IRISH ATHLETICS Irish spirit we all know our athletes approach sporting

of her friends, time at a recent lunch allowed them to reminisce about their fellow teacher and friend.

Marlys Lyons taught with Georgene at Trinity and recalls walking the Mardi Gras parade route with Georgene who began the tradition of the 2nd grade float which still continues today. Marlys says Georgene was never without her high heels even on the night of the parade! Christi Goldbeck remembers that Georgene had a love of the arts and "encouraged so many students to express their feelings through writing and acting."

Janelle (**Donovan**) Kross (**SMHS 1967**) credits Georgene as her role model and remembers her "enthusiasm for teaching" that she conveyed to her students and coworkers. Sue Carstensen says that Georgene always had time to stop whatever she was doing to help her. Beulah Hessing reminded everyone of one of Georgene's favorite quotes as "When your life brings some lemons your way – make lemonade – it always works."

Georgene appears to have had a profound influence on her co-workers and no doubt inspired many young people during her years at our elementary schools. Georgene passed away on November 8, 2015 in Phoenix, AZ.

NEWS FOR IOWA TAXPAYERS: A 65% Tax Credit

An STO (School Tuition Organization) is a charitable organization that receives contributions from Iowa taxpayers and allocates those contributions, in the form of tuition grants, to Iowa school children attending non-public schools. STO grants give the gift of school choice to families who otherwise could not afford it. Donors enjoy a 65% Iowa income tax credit and a federal tax deduction (if they itemize deductions).


