FROM FOOTBALL HERO TO GIRLS' SPORTS COACH

It is probably a sure bet that the 18 year-old, 6 foot, 190-pound senior halfback for St. Mary's High School, just named in the October 21, 1963 issue of Sports Illustrated "Faces in the Crowd" section, never imagined that he would leave

his legacy as a coach of high school girls' athletics. But that is exactly what happened to Mike Nixon.

Mike was born in Clinton on June 24, 1945 and graduated from St. Mary's High School in 1964. He continued his education at Northeast Missouri State University and graduated in 1969 with a degree in Education that carried him back to his alma mater to begin his teaching career as PE teacher for St. Mary's and St. Patrick Grade Schools.

In 1971, Mike became the sole PE teacher for all St. Mary's students (grade 1-12). In addition to his teaching job, Mike, with Max Lynn, and John Lingle, recognized how important girls' athletics would be to the young women at St. Mary's. They started to work in developing track and basketball teams at St. Mary's and moved on to softball and then volleyball.

Teresa Nelson, long-time friend of Mike and mother of five St. Mary's High School graduates, speaks fondly as she remembers all that Mike Nixon did for her girls and their teammates. Teresa states, "It meant a lot to the girls and it thrilled them to death (to be part of a team)." While she remembers that Mike was a tough coach who expected hard work and determination from his girls, Teresa said he would show a softer side and call her the night before an out-of-town meet or game and ask her to "make some treats for the girls." According to Teresa, "Mike was always doing things for kids" including dressing up as a leprechaun on St. Patrick's Dav.

"In basketball practice, Mr. Nixon had us doing some drills that may have come from his football days. One of those drills was actually named, *Blood and Guts*," shared Kathy (Witt) McGuire SMHS 1975. "I can't imagine what high school would have been like without girls' sports."

In 1988, Mike married his former college friend, Syd Howe. By this time, Mike had left the teaching profession and began working in restaurant management in Clinton. Later he worked at Hawkeye Chemical, and eventually retired from Mercy Hospital. Syd smiles as she speaks of Mike. She describes him as a "very kind, caring, and loving man." She is happy to say that he shied away from gossip and that he was a loyal friend. His circle of friends chose a Saturday every fall to go to watch their beloved Notre Dame play. One year he went to Ireland to see Notre Dame play Navy in Dublin.

Mike Nixon,72, passed away on July 26, 2017, after a tenmonth battle with gastric cancer. As Syd shared her memories of Mike including newspaper articles, awards, and photographs, she offered a silver bowl from Sports Illustrated commemorating his mention in that October 1963 issue to Prince of Peace Catholic School. The school is honored to receive such a wonderful piece from Syd and will proudly display it in the Central Catholic Auditorium trophy case.

For nearly 45 years, girls' athletics at our Catholic Schools have among others Mike Nixon to thank for that initial vision to begin something small that would blossom into such an important part of many girls' lives. We thank Mike Nixon for being a visionary and for persevering in his goals to give girls the opportunities to explore and excel in athletics.

A memorial has been established in Mike Nixon's name to support the Prince of Peace Catholic School Athletic program. These funds will be used towards a gym floor "facelift" project at Central Catholic Auditorium (CCA), where the Irish currently practice and compete. 

Hop On PoP To A Seussical Parade

Following a long standing tradition, our 2nd grade parents built a float for the Mardi Gras parade on October 30th. Using this year's "Seussical" parade theme, they did us proud with this first place entry.

Prince of Peace science teacher, Dr. Katharine Atkinson (known affectionately as "Dr. A.") and her Environmental Science students spent some time at the Prince of Peace Church property to help restore balance to the watershed areas. Several areas of the waterways were over taken by invasive Phragmite plants which spread through marshes and wetlands pushing out native cattails, other plants and animal life.

In June, Prince of Peace School was awarded an American Water Environmental Grant for \$850 to continue restoration and monitoring of the watershed project from Iowa American Water. The

funds will help pay for seeds, supplies and eco-friendly herbicides to control the invasive plants while promoting cattail and other productive plant growth. This school/parish project will help keep our important waterways healthier and provide the Mill Creek watershed region with a better environment for plants, wildlife, and humans, now and for many years to come. 
Welcome Miss Jessalyn Small
