
Facility To Be Ready For 1998 School Year!

new multi-purpose center will provide a modern class-room setting for children of the Prince of Peace Catholic Education System in the years to come!

The development plans call for eight multi-purpose classrooms, a science hall, library/media center, and music room. The new center will be multi-purpose in nature, meaning that it will house grades 7-12 children of the Parish junior high and high school, grades 7-12 of the Parish Religious Education Program in the evenings, adult education and meeting space for Parish and community needs.

The new center will be built north of the existing Trinity Elementery school building (located next to Sacred Heart church) which houses K-6th grade students. Grades 7-12 students will be moved from the Mater Dei High School (former St. Mary's High School) building to the new center when it is completed, by the fall of 1998.

After the education center is completed, the Mater Dei building (which was first used in 1927) and the former St. Mary grade school building will be razed and grades 7-12 (page 2)

Burke Returns - As Principal

r. David Burke, Area Superintendent of the Freeport Catholic Schools has accepted the position of Administrator for the Prince of Peace Catholic Schools in Clinton. The Prince of Peace School System includes Trinity Early Learning Center, Trinity Elementary, and Mater Dei High School. Mr. Burke replaces James Anderson, Administrator at Prince of Peace Schools for the past six years.

Mr. Burke began his teaching career in Clinton at St. Mary's High School in 1974 where he taught until 1977. He has administrative experince in Wisconsin, Illinois, and Iowa.

He has been principal at St. Mary's Elementary, Platteville, Wisconsin; John F. Kennedy School, Davenport, Iowa; and most recently, Principal of elementary and secondary Catholic schools in Freeport, Illinois. His experience also includes college teaching at Scott Community College and St. Ambrose University in Davenport.

Mr. Burke takes over the Prince of Peace School System at an exciting time as plans for building the new education center develop. He brings a strong track record of raising enrollment at his previous positions.

Mr. Burke is married to Maureen, a nurse, and they have three children, Tim, Kelly and Pat.

Modern Facility To Replace Deterioring Buildings

moved to make room for the expansion of the new Prince of Peace Church at the St. Mary's church site.

Prince of Peace Parish currently uses buildings at three different property locations to provide its K-12 Catholic school program. The consolidation of the Parish education programs to a single site will mean a significant enhancement in efficiency, maintenance, and administration with a high quality facility.

The proposed cost of the Prince of Peace Education expansion is estimated at \$2 million.

Clinton Catholic schools have not been new to the idea of change or consolidation. In 1969, North

Catholic was formed as St. Boniface and St. Irenaeus grade schools merged. In 1982, St. Patrick and St. Mary grade schools formed Seton Elementary, and in 1987 North Catholic, Seton and Sacred Heart formed the present Trinity Elementary School System. In 1980, St. Mary's High School merged with Mount St. Clare Academy, which formed the current Mater Dei High School. Mater Dei High School, Trinity Elementary and Trinity Early Learning Center now form the Prince of Peace School System.


Will there be another name change in the future? Time will tell. The important thing is that the rich tradition of Catholic education in Clinton will continue. The future is bright, and the plan is in motion!

August Brings Alumni Appeal
