Dear Friends of Catholic Education.

As I reflect back on my first year, I have been able to realize so many blessings. As I have known for many years, having taught at Mater Dei High School for ten years, I am blessed by the wonderful faculty and support staff with whom I work. Their dedication and commitment to our school is awesome. The student body is delightful. One of the neat perks of my job are the hugs. It's not unusual to walk down the hallway and receive several hugs from beautiful, smiling faces, sometimes-toothless ones.

The older students are also a delight to watch grow and mature. I really appreciate their sense of humor, their honesty and their commitment to our school as well. Our parish priests have also been a tremendous blessing not only to me, but also to students, staff, faculty and parents. They take the time out of their very busy lives to spend time in our classrooms and prepare very meaningful liturgies for our students.

Many good things are happening in our school this year. One of these is a new course being offered to juniors and seniors entitled Christian Leadership. In addition to delivering communion to the home bound

We have much to be grateful for in Clinton. We are able to keep our Catholic schools in operation through a close connection with our parish community. In November close to 100 of our teens went to the Youth Rally sponsored by the Diocese of Davenport, several hundred more attended a parish youth mission with Jesse Manibusan, a renowned Catholic composer, storyteller, and singer. In December I am preparing to go with seventy of our youth to the National Catholic Youth Conference in Indianapolis. Good things are happening in our school and with our youth.

She has received national recognition from the International Library of Poets. She received the nomination as Poet of the Year in 1999-2000 and again in 2001.


