★he Prince of Peace Prep Boys Cross Country Team finished fifth in the Class 1A State Cross Country Meet in Fort Dodge on October 28.

With the entire team sporting dyed blue hair for the race, sophomore Drew Sikkema placed sixth with a 17 minute time on the 5,000-meter course. Riley Bly finished 27th, Josh Lawrence

33rd, Dan Schnier 44th and Ben Lehmkuhl 111th for the Irish.

The team qualified for State in magnificent fashion, claiming the District Crown on October 19 at Starmont, with 1st, 2nd, 10th, 11th and 38th place finishes. Dave Lawrence coached the youthful team to several victories during the regular season, including the Big East Conference crown.





Honorary Diploma Awarded to 98-Year-Old

Man's Son Arranges Final, Deserved Reward

Tinety-eight-year-old Charles A. Kinney of Rock Island received his high school diploma on July 11, 2006 – 82 years after dropping out of school so he could help support his family.

Charles had completed his sophomore year at St. Mary's High School in 1924 when economics forced him to get

a job at Curtis Lumber. His father had died in 1923.

Last summer, Charles' son, Capt. Chuck P. Kinney, called Prince of Peace College Preparatory from his home in Colorado to ask if school

> administrators would consider awarding his father an honorary diploma. Chuck said his dad mentioned regret over the years about never completing high school.

> School Administrator Nancy L. Peart agreed immediately. "It's a rare opportunity to be able to fulfill someone's longtime dream and we were glad to cooperate," she remarked.

> The elder Kinney went on to become a successful business-

man, owning and operating an office supply and furniture store in Rock Island for 31 years. He saw to it that both of his children, Chuck and

Kehls Found College Scholarship for Irish Graduates

obby A. Kehl and Tina M. Kehl established a Scholarship in their name in May and awarded the first annual Kehl Scholarship to 2006 Graduate Spenser Mussman earlier this year.

The Kehl Scholarship Fund will provide a \$20,000 scholarship, distributed in \$2,500 increments over eight consecutive semesters, to a single Prince of Peace College Prep senior who will pursue a college education.

"Our goal is to provide students who show great potential a means of support in their pursuit of higher education. It's important to us to recognize students who have shown perseverance, leadership, and outstanding commitment to their community over their years in high school," Bobby Kehl said.

"This is an extremely unique type of scholarship and opportunity for students because of the amount and the ongoing nature of the funding," said Prince of Peace Principal Nancy L. Peart.

"To be offered specifically for a Prince of Peace student, makes it a great opportunity for our kids," she continued. "We are very grateful."

Bobby and Tina Kehl have a son, Alex Kruse, who is a junior at Prince of Peace. The couple are co-owners of Riverside Casino, near Iowa City. The scholarship recipient is selected by a committee comprised of faculty members, a school board member and the school principal.



Dear Alumni and Friends.

Over the past several years, we have seen the issue of clergy sexual abuse repeatedly in the news and one wonders what effect this has on all of us as members of the Catholic Church, as parishioners of Prince of Peace Parish and as alumni of our Catholic Schools. We know that there are two tragedies that have occurred in the Catholic Church: first, the sexual abuse by clergy itself, a tragedy of monumental proportions, and, second, the cover up that took place over the years.

Following in the footsteps of Jesus, the role of the Church is to be a support to all those who suffer, to initiate dialog and to develop better relationships among people. Even those who have not been sexually abused have suffered from this scandal.

The Diocese of Davenport has been greatly affected by a few of its priests who have been accused of clergy sexual abuse. A few years ago the Diocese settled grievances against some priests for approximately ten million dollars. More cases have come forward and the Diocese has had to declare Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Reorganization in an attempt to ensure that all who were hurt by these crimes can receive some degree of support and compensation. As part of the bankruptcy settlement, the courts are asking that anyone who has been abused by a priest in our diocese to come forward to make a claim by February of 2007.

Among the many, many priests who have served the parishes in the City of Clinton and our Catholic schools, the diocese has substantiated claims against James Janssen, William Wiebler and Francis Bass. A few other priests have also been accused of abuse. I would encourage anyone who feels a need for counseling or a listening ear to contact the Davenport Diocese Victims Assistance Coordinator, Alicia Owens at her email address: vacdav@attglobal.net or phone her at (563) 349-5002. "My father passed away in June of 2003. He was a tremendous supporter of Catholic education and worked very hard to see that all of his nine children had the opportunity for that experience," said Vernon's daughter, Mary Pat Connell (SMHS 1977).

Deb Lind Scholarship Lives On

1 ince 1998, 14 Prince of Peace Prep studentathletes have earned Deb Lind Scholarships, chosen for exemplifying Deb's trademarks of hard work, fair play and sportsmanship. Deb was a P.E. teacher and coach at St. Pat's, Seton and Trinity elementary schools and Mater Dei High School, for 22 years. She died of ocular melanoma in 1997 and her family began a 5K road race, "Deb's Dash," in her honor. Proceeds from that race, which was held every Memorial Day through 2005, helped build an endowment.

Deb's mother, Florence Dingmon of Clinton, said Deb enjoyed coaching, especially the younger students, "Her policy with the kids was they all should have a turn."

Deb was a MSCA 1970

graduate and an athlete in her own right. She played softball, golfed, enjoyed running and was a good swimmer. She went on to play volleyball for the University of Northern Iowa.

Deb returned to Clinton to teach and coached basketball, golf and volleyball over the years. Her students respected and admired her and the entire volleyball team attended her funeral dressed in uniform.

Deb's Dash began at St. Boniface and followed Pershing Blvd. Over eight years, parish priests led the race on foot, by bike and on jeep. Deb's Dash was a family affair with her siblings and parents participating. Although the race "has run its course," Dingmon said scholarships in Deb's name will continue to be awarded. NOTEWORTHY ALUMNI

During 2005, Clinton's Sesquicentennial year, the *Clinton Herald* reported **Rev. Martin Cone** enrolled at St. Mary's in 1892 and was the first native St. Mary's parishioner ordained a priest in 1912. He later was president of St. Ambrose College.

Mary Smith of Algona, Ia. and Eleanor Sanchez of Albuquerque, N.M., daughters of Cora Creed (Chamberlain) Fleming, OLA circa 1908, visited this summer and told us Cora was sent to board at OLA at age 12 in 1902. Cora's widowed mother was a model in Chicago. Cora went on to graduate from the Chicago Music Conservatory.

Ed Engler, SMHS 1932, of Santa Barbara, Calif., corresponded last spring and said he would turn 92 in October. Ed said he started a school newspaper while at St. Mary's and named it "BluGold." Ed wrote, "Bank of America recently announced 19,000 millionaires live in Santa Barbara. There are 90,000 who are not and I am one of them."

A recent *Clinton Herald* history item noted that Warren McEleney and Marvin Ohsann, SMHS 1939, received the St. Mary's Alumni Association gold medals for earning the highest four-year average in Religion.
