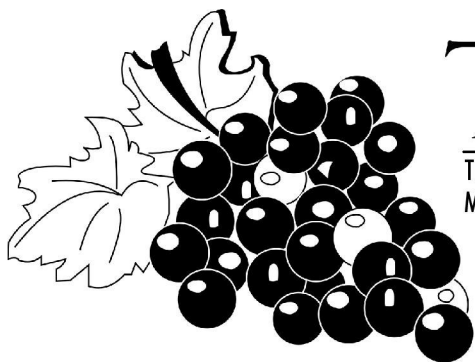

Irish Senior Raises the Bar

Prince of Peace senior Lilly Isenhour has set the new standard for Irish girls' basketball. In her final season in blue and gold, Isenhour joined a very exclusive group when she scored her 1,000th career point for the Irish. But she had her eye on a record that she wanted to break.

Lilly is the youngest daughter of Andy (SMHS '80) and Tammy (Vicks, SMHS '80) Isenhour. All of Lilly's older siblings are also Prince of Peace grads, including Erik (POPCP '05), Tori (POPCP '07), Katie (POPCP '11), and Julia (POPCS '13). While all of the Isenhours have been gifted on the court, piling up stats and accolades along the way, Lilly's sister Tori is the one who held the school's rebound record, collecting 762 of them in her career.

Lilly Isenhour not only broke her sister's rebound record, but she shattered it, setting the new Irish girls' rebound record at 1,018.

Isenhour has always been searching for ways to

be the best. Irish head coach Dave Nelson recalls a question Isenhour asked during her freshman season: "What do I need to do to have you stop talking about [my sisters] and start talking about me?"

Isenhour piled up the stats and piled up the wins for the Irish during her time in school. Upon her graduation, she will continue on to Carl Sandburg College, not to play basketball, but to play volleyball.

"A representative from the Army National Guard gave us many suggestions for what items are needed most," says Sarah White, Campus Minister at Prince of Peace Catholic School. "Individual packets of water flavoring, stationary, and other supplies for soldiers to write home is what

is wanted the most."

White says students were very excited to get involved in this project. "Because we are a Catholic school, we're always looking for new ways to give back to others. We're trying to serve our community in as many ways as possible."

An article about this project was also featured in an NCEA newsletter, which is a

national news outlet focused on Catholic schools in the United States.

Sister Martha Ryder, BVM

1927-2021

Sister Martha (Briant) Ryder, BVM of Mount Carmel Bluffs, Dubuque, passed away on November 21, 2021 at the age of 94. Sister Martha served Clinton Catholic schools as a high school math teacher for twenty-two years before her retirement in 2005.

Sister Martha was born and raised in St. Louis, Missouri. After graduating from college, she entered the BVM congregation on September 8, 1948, from St. Margaret of Scotland Parish in St. Louis. She professed her first vows on March 19, 1951, and her final vows on August 15, 1956. She was highly educated and held two master's degrees in physics and was endorsed to teach mathematics, physics, and chemistry. Prior to arriving in Clinton, she taught for one year at Immaculata High School in Chicago, followed by twenty years as chair and instructor in the physical science/physics department at Clarke University in Dubuque. She joined the faculty at Mater Dei High School in 1983, teaching mathematics, physics, and computer classes.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her brother Bill. She is survived by the Sisters of Charity, BVM, with whom she shared life for 73 years. Eternal rest grant unto her, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. May she rest in peace. Amen. ♣



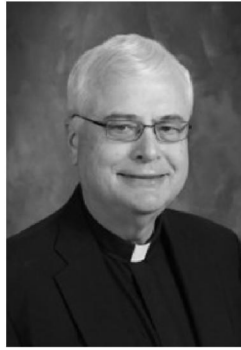
Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace Priests Reassigned

Bishop Thomas Zinkula, the Bishop of Davenport, has announced priest reassignments, effective July 1, 2022. With this change, Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace Parish pastor, Fr. Ken Kuntz, and parochial vicar, Fr. John Stack, have received new assignments.

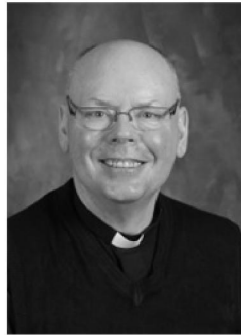
Fr. Ken Kuntz will retire this summer but will continue to serve as a member of the diocese's College of Consultors. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1977. Fr. Ken has previously served at numerous previous assignments, including St. Joseph Parish (DeWitt) and St. Mary Parish (Iowa City). He has been the pastor of Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace Parish since 2010.

Fr. John Stack will become the parochial vicar at Holy Family Parish in Fort Madison and St. Joseph Parish in Montrose. Fr. Stack was ordained to the priesthood in 1988 and has served at many parishes throughout the diocese, including Church of the Visitation (Camanche), Sacred Heart Parish (Lost Nation), St. James Parish (Toronto), St. Patrick Parish (Charlotte), Ss. Mary & Joseph Parish (Sugar Creek), and Ss. Phillip & James Parish (Grand Mound). He has also served as chaplain at Mercy Medical Center (Clinton), The Alverno (Clinton), and the Sisters of St. Francis (Clinton). In addition to his parochial vicar assignment, Fr. Stack has also taught middle school religion classes at Prince of Peace Catholic School. He has been parochial vicar at Prince of Peace Parish since 2017.

The Clinton Catholic School community thanks Fr. Ken and Fr. Stack for their service to our church, school, and the Clinton community. We ask that you keep both of them in your prayers as they move forward. ♣

New Priests Assigned to Clinton

On July 1, 2022, a new pastor and parochial vicar will begin their assignments in Clinton's Catholic church and school.

Fr. Paul Appel is set to become the fourth pastor of Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace Parish. He is currently the pastor at St. Peter Parish (Buffalo), St. Alphonsus Parish (Davenport), and Holy Family Parish (Davenport). He is a canon lawyer and will continue to serve as the judicial vicar, vice chancellor, and delegate of the bishop in matrimonial matters for the Diocese of Davenport. He was ordained to the priesthood in 2003.

Fr. John Lamansky will become parochial vicar of the parish and will also serve as the chaplain of Prince of Peace Catholic School. He graduated from Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio and completed his advanced studies at Mundelein Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois. Afterwards, he completed theology studies at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. He currently serves as the parochial vicar at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish (Bettendorf). He was ordained to the priesthood in 2018.

Both priests are very eager to join the Clinton Catholic community. "Both Fr. Appel and Fr. Lamansky have expressed interest in working very closely with our school," says Andrew Bradley, Principal of Prince of Peace Catholic School. "We are exploring ways to get them very involved in our day-to-day school life, including teaching religion classes and spiritual advising for our high school students."

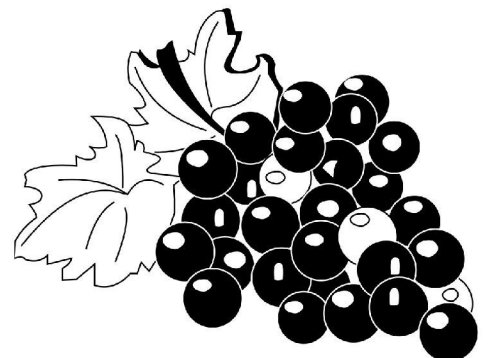
Prince of Peace Catholic School expresses our welcome to both Fr. Appel and Fr. Lamansky and are looking forward to working together for years to come. ♣
