

# MSC Becomes The Franciscan University

With plans to continue to increase its educational scope, Mount St. Clare College became "The Franciscan University" December 5, 2002. The University will maintain "Mount St. Clare" as the name of its college for undergraduate studies.

The change to University status was approved by the College's Board of Trustees during its November meeting and then by the Sisters of St. Francis, sponsors of the College. The change in status was effective December 5 but there will be a transition period in order to totally complete the change.

Sister Marilyn Huegerich, President of the Sisters of St. Francis, said, "The name change is not about letting go. It is about embracing the Franciscan mission in a new way. It is time to expand to university status in recognition of recent ventures into graduate education. The new name makes clear the Catholic identity of the institution and the universal Franciscan values it espouses."

Athletics teams, academic clubs and other student organizations will continue to use "Mount St. Clare" through the spring 2003 semester. Winter and spring graduates will receive diplomas having the MSC name. The University's athletic teams will be known

as the Saints and the institution's colors will remain gold and purple.

### Former Teacher Nominated as Poet of the Year

Former Prince of Peace Academy and Trinity Elementary teacher Georgene Krogman watched the news September 11, listening to reports about the terrorist attacks and envisioning Ellis Island and the people of New York and all the turmoil. "I wondered, 'What would our Stature of Liberty say if she could speak? What message would she send us?;" Krogman said from her home in Tennessee. "Our lives are very fragile: life can change in a heartbeat. Krogman was moved to write a poem, "Our Lady Speaks," which has earned her a nomination as one of the International Poets of the Year 2002.

She was presented with an engraved silver award bowl and medallion at the August International Society of Poets convention and symposium in Washington, DC. She also has been offered a chance to publish a book of her poems.


