Hope this third issue of the "GRAPEVINE" finds you and your family in good spirits and grateful for our many gifts from God Almighty.

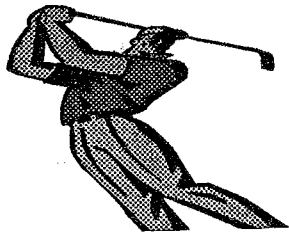

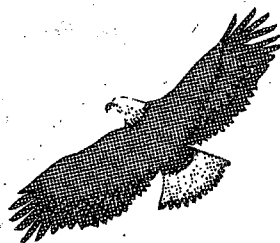

NEW FACILITY UPDATE

A proposed plan for a new facility which would replace the existing Mater Dei facility and the St. Mary's grade school building is being considered. Meetings have been held regularly since November of 1993 to determine the function and layout of a multi-purpose facility that would accommodate the school and parish needs identified in a 1994 Parish Task Force study. Members of the Parish Council, Finance Council and School Board have met with an architect to develop floor-plans for the facility.

A general consensus of the floor-plan design and an affirmative vote from the Parish to proceed is needed before initiating a feasibility study for the project. It is anticipated that Parish approval may be made this summer for a feasibility study to begin. FIFTEENTH ANNUAL COMMENCEMENT EXERCISE FOR MATER DEI HIGH SCHOOL

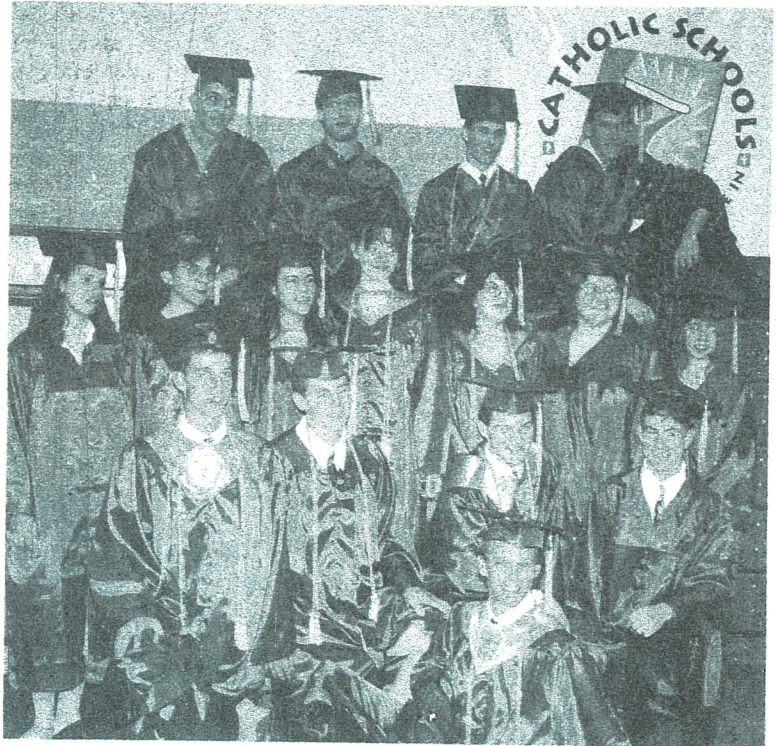
