Mrs. Nancy Peart, long-time parishioner, graduate of St. Mary's High School ('69) and English teacher at Mater Dei High School for the past eight years was hired this past June as the new administrator for Prince of Peace School.

Mrs. Peart received her degree in English from the

University of Iowa in 1973 and taught in Clinton public schools for nine years. While she took time off to raise her three children, two of whom have graduated from Mater Dei and one is a freshman at Prince of Peace Prep, she volunteered in the Catholic school system. She





A dear friend of Catholic education in Clinton died November 8th. Sr. Mary Kelly, B.V.M., a graduate of Our Lady of Angels, became a Sister of Charity after receiving her education from Clarke College in Dubuque, Iowa and from Notre Dame University. Sister Kelly taught science at Mater Dei High School for many years. Even after her retirement, she continued to help at Mater Dei in many ways. She was a substitute teacher, made bulletin boards for teachers, compiled data from surveys, kept the teacher's work room organized, frequently brought treats to the teachers, planned and taught enriching science experiments for the elementary students. Whenever she would visit relatives in the area, she would stop by the school for hugs and a visit.

At the time of her death, she was residing in Chicago and was teaching at Connections Learning Center and School of Religion for Developmentally Challenged Adults. She also tutored minority women to help them earn their General Equivalency Diplomas. She will be sorely missed.
