Joseph Timmer Gifts

t wasn't such a surprise that Joseph J. Timmer included his Parish in his will, but the amount sure was. Afterall, Joseph Timmer was a consistent giver to the church, and faithfully attended daily Mass, but he also lived a modest lifestyle as a retired truck driver.

His nephew Jim Timmer, Sr. (SMHS'46) recalls how his uncle Joe always wanted to give back to the church. "All his life that's what he intended for his money." Not only did Joseph bequest \$448,252 to Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace Parish, but he also included a \$225,000 gift to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association.

Fr. Young, Parish pastor when the bequest was made, knew Timmer took support of the Church seriously, but was surprised by the amount of the unrestricted gift. Joseph Timmer was blessed with his gift of faith and he expressed that faith and gratitude to God through his estate plans.

aren Cossman has been an Art teacher at Mater Dei Jr/Sr. High School since its formation from the merger of Mount St. Clare Academy and St. Mary's High School in 1980. Karen is one person who can testify to the beauty of the new Prince of Peace Education Center. Karen, who has been confined to a wheelchair from an auto accident in 1979, encountered many barriers at the old high school building.

"I'm free to travel to any area of the Center. I feel more included in the school's life.

Karen Cossman, Art Teacher Karen had to enter the old school building from a ramp and go to her first-floor Art Room, but the concrete ramp was her only convenience. There was no access to the 2nd floor, the small gym, the teacher's lunchroom or school restrooms. The only accessible restroom would require her to wheel outdoors to go over to Central Catholic Auditorium. "Now, I am free to travel to any area of the Center. I feel more included in the school's life. I can enjoy lunch with my fellow teachers, visit any classroom I wish, and be part of the many activities that are held in the auditorium.

New Center is Multi-Purpose



ugust 23, 1998 was the Dedication date of the new Prince of Peace Catholic Education Center. On August 24th, the first day of the 1998-1999 school year began for grades K-12 in the modern facility site at 312 South Fourth Street, next to Sacred Heart church. Since that day, the multi-purpose education center has lived up to its expectations with amazing success. The center has become a mecca in the life of our Paris community, serving a variety of people, programs and organizations.

In addition to bringing the Parish K-12 Catholic school system to one site, the new addition provides a new home to families and public school students who are involved in the Parish Religious Education Program. The new facility is air-conditioned. It also provides a new music room for all grade levels of our Parish school

and Parish religious education program. "The new center far exceeds the closet area, stages, insufficient classroom space and lack of noise control which our children, teachers and catechists had to tolerate over the years," states Betty Mantsch, Director of Religious Education.

Thanks to the gift from the Rick and Cyndi Winter family, a brand new elevator was funded for the education center. Their gift helped make the dream of a fully accessible, K-12, multi-purpose, education facility a reality. Because of its unique architectural design, the two story facility is now handicap accessible throughout the entire building, for all grades.

In addition to the Parish school and religious education programs, the education facility is used extensively for ongoing meetings or events-from various groups and organizations. These include: Parish Council, Parish Finance Council, Parish School Board, Prince of Peace Education Foundation, Parish Youth Group, Women's Auxiliary, Knights of Columbus and the SHARE Program. The new addition adds 25,000 square feet of climate controlled space onto the existing elementary building which was constructed in 1957.







IRISH MAKE HISTORY AGAIN By Joseph E. O'Donnell

On February 5, 1999, the Mater Dei Irish celebrated their Homecoming by surprising the state-ranked and otherwise undefeated Preston Trojans. They made history by becoming the fifth Irish squad to spoil another teams perfect season. The other victims (all in tournament) were: Delwood of Elwood in 1965, North Linn in 1977, Preston in 1980, and East Central of Miles in 1987.

At the end of the last decade, Blue and Gold Illustrated, the official football newspaper of the University of Notre Dame, selected a pivotal game for each decade. Well I have selected a pivotal game for each decade in Irish basketball. In the fifties, it was the one point win over Lyons High School in the sectional final at Goose Lake when Dick Lingle connected from center court at the buzzer. In the sixties, it was our 61 to 42 victory over Clinton High School in the district final at Yourd, our first cage win ever over the River Kings. In the seventies, it was our 52 to 50 victory over Iowa City Regina in the district final at Muscatine when Brent Murphy swished a jumper from the top of the key at the buzzer. In the eighties, it was the 59 to 54 win at Clinton High School, the first victory over the River Kings in 16 years. And in the nineties, it is the 64 to 56 win over Iowa Mennonite of Kalona in the sub-state at Cedar Rapids Prairie for our first trip to state in 16 years.


The WAREHAM REUNION
