Iowa Passes Historic School Choice Law

2023, Iowa January Governor Kim Reynolds signed the "Students First Act" into law after passage in both legislative chambers. When fully implemented, every Iowa student in kindergarten through twelfth grade will be eligible for an "education savings account" to use for private school tuition if they choose to exit an assigned public school district.

"With this new law in place, most students will be able to attend Prince of Peace Catholic School for little to no cost to their family," says Nate Vander Bleek, Prince of Peace Advancement Director. "For generations, Catholic and private school has been an option for some but not all, and was usually reserved for folks who can afford it. But now, all families will have a choice in their child's education, regardless of their income level."

The program's three-year rollout begins in the 2023-2024 <u>Iowa, continued on page 4</u>

school year, beginning with new students and current students that meet income requirements. By the 2025-2026 school year, every student in the state will be eligible for an education savings account. Iowa will be the third state in the country to implement a universal school choice program.

While final enrollment numbers have vet to be determined, Prince of Peace Catholic School is seeing a marked uptick in interest from new students and families. Joseph E. Brown, Sr., principal at Prince of Peace, anticipates the school to grow in the next few years. "We are already seeing people come in to explore our school who may have never considered this to be an option because of the cost. We are very honored with the opportunity to bring new students into our school, regardless of their family's financial situation. We're also pleased to offer more options to our current families, most of whom currently need to make sacrifices to provide a Catholic education to their child."

While this new law means virtually endless opportunities

for our students and school community, it does not mean that the school will change its mission. Vander Bleek says, "Prince of Peace will never be a public school. We will always hold our Catholic identity in the highest regard, and the faithformation of our children is in our utmost priority."

The Advancement Office has also received numerous questions about the future of fundraising and the Many & One Annual Fund. "We are not anticipating any changes to the way we raise funds for our school, at least in the interim," Vander Bleek "Stewardship is still a very important piece of running our school, and we are very grateful to everyone who helps, whether it be through their contribution of time, talent, or treasure."

Principal Brown says, "Taxpayer dollars should go to children. End of discussion. Prince of Peace is not going to be the best school choice for some, just as [the public school system] may not be the best for some. But this new law puts the choice in the hands of parents, not in the hands of the government."

he Grapevine staff found a book of facts and history the about Clinton Catholic schools. Included was some information about the origin of the "Fighting Irish" nickname. The first St. Mary's sporting event was a football game against St. Irenaeus in 1915. St. Mary's coach, Father Joseph H. O'Donnell, was a descendant of Red O'Donnell, a sixteenth-century leader of the Gaelic nobility in Ireland. Red Hugh fought Queen Elizabeth I of England during the Protestant Revolt, so Father O'Donnell named his squad "The Fighting Irish" to honor his ancestor.
