1999 MATER DEI GRADUATE IS SEEING (RED) STARS

When Clinton native and Mater Dei graduate Alyse LaHue attended our Clinton Catholic schools, her passion was for the basketball court rather than the soccer field. As we all know, life typically takes many twists and turns as we find our way to satisfying employment. Alvse appears to have taken the fast track from an assistant soccer coach at the university level to a professional team general manager.

After graduating from Mater Dei, Alyse went to St. Ambrose University in Davenport and graduated in 2004 with her degree in Informational Business. After graduation she started coaching soccer and had the opportunity to be a graduate assistant coach for the St. Ambrose women's soccer team. This experience, she says, led her to pursue and obtain her Master's Degree of Business Administration. A series of odd jobs to supplement her coaching income finally led to a dream iob. Today Alvse serves as the General Manager for the Chicago Red Stars, a women's professional soccer team affiliated with the National Women's Soccer League playing home games in Lisle, Illinois.

The Chicago Red Stars team was founded in 2007 and first competed professionally in WPS (Women's Professional Soccer) for 2 years, before moving down to semi-pro for two seasons. The team then returned to professional status with the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). Alyse mentions that the team won the National Cup in 2011. This year's season was not a championship year for the team which was

saddled with numerous injuries. The team has their eye on a 2014 championship with a game plan ready to go.

"As GM of a pro sports team, I am really involved in every single aspect of running the team. Everything, on and off the field, is run as a business and there area many elements that make it tick", says Alyse. For Alyse, every day is different. She keeps her eye on PR, marketing, finance, is a cheerleader for her players and tries to keep their dreams alive. The future for the Chicago Red Stars is bright. Alyse says the team is "looking forward to the future and continuing to find sustaining success for women's soccer in America."

Alyse encourages all young people to find what they love and to work hard to pursue their dreams. In her spare time away from the pressures of her job, Alyse devoted time to co-found a non-profit organization called Gonzo Soccer that teaches life skills and soccer to inner-city girls. The organization operates in several US cities and Mexico. She also enjoys

reading biographies and memoirs and enjoys hiking in and around the Chicago area.

Clinton will always feel like home for Alyse who returns several times each year to visit her mother and several family members that still live in the area.




