Mary (Dehner) Jensen knows more than a little bit about Catholic education. When it comes to Catholic schools, Mary has been involved as a student, a graduate, a parent, a volunteer, a preschool and childcare director, and a grandparent. This level of involvement in Catholic education in Clinton, makes Mary an ideal candidate for our alumni focus.

Mary Dehner graduated from St. Mary's High School in 1973 at a time when, if you were a member of a Catholic family, you likely went to a Catholic school. Mary's parents, George and Bea Dehner, were committed to Catholic education and made it possible for their seven children to all graduate from St. Mary's High School. Her elementary years were spent at St. Mary's Grade School and after eighth grade, she made the short walk over to the high school for the next four years. Mary remembers that her neighborhood was full of St. Mary's kids.

Mary went on to cosmetology school and in 1974 married Eric Jensen. They settled in Clinton and over the years were blessed with five children – Stacie, Nick, Bob, Joy, and Ben – all of whom graduated from either Mater Dei or Prince of Peace High School. Anyone with a child or two in a Catholic school knows that once you begin your parent volunteer experience with a school, you can be involved a little or a lot. Mary became involved a lot! With five children in the school system at different grade levels, Mary found herself “involved in just about every level of the school system.” Mary echoes what many parents say about meeting great friends and parents just by volunteering. “I was privileged to make great friends who bonded together building (Halloween) floats, working concessions, and working many fundraisers.”

As her children progressed through the school system, it would have been easy for Mary to slowly back away from her involvement with the school. Instead in the early 1990s, Mary became an employee of the school and currently serves as Prince of Peace Catholic School's director of the Preschool and Childcare Center which is located above St. Boniface Hall. The vibrant and active center houses preschool and pre-kindergarten for 3 to 5 year olds and offers fully licensed childcare for infants up to kindergarten age. Mary feels blessed “to work with a great staff that love being with children.”

Today Mary and Eric are thrilled to be starring in the role of Grandma and Grandpa to nine grandchildren and have four of them (all girls) at Prince of Peace Catholic School. Two daughters of Stacie (MDHS 1994) and Kevin Kenneavy and Joy (POPCP 2002) and Chris Evans are in the middle and elementary grades. Mary is grateful that this next generation is

able to enjoy a Catholic education just as she and their mothers did.

As Mary looks back over her years at SMHS, she relates that her favorite high school teacher was Sr. Mary Annetta, BVM, who “taught us so much more than English.” Mary remembers trips to Mr. Quick's for a 60 cent lunch. Rastrelli's was the destination for Mary and her friends after football and basketball games. Perhaps some readers of this article will remember stealing the goose for the top of a homecoming bonfire. Mary assures everyone that “accomplices will remain anonymous.” The SMHS class of 1973 has had class reunions and Mary agrees that it is a great time to catch up with classmates and for remembering those simpler times of life.

Mary and Eric Jensen made the commitment of a Catholic education for their five children because of the family atmosphere it offers. Mary says that this opportunity has given their family a chance to be “part of a close community of faith that has been the treasure of our life.” Their children and now grandchildren have great opportunities to participate in a wide variety of activities and are encouraged to try new things. With children, you can expect bumps in the road and Mary and Eric have “weathered a few storms” but also “shared many joys with our Prince of Peace family.” As retirement years loom in the future, Mary says that right now she and Eric can't wait to be involved in more school activities and to watch their grandchildren grow.

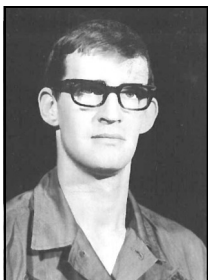

ROBERT SHANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP ESTABLISHED IN FOUNDATION



The Robert Shannon Memorial Scholarship has been established by Robert's older brother, John Shannon (SMHS 1962). John first contacted our office wanting to do something that would keep Robert's memory alive. Establishing this scholarship in the Prince of Peace School Foundation will honor Robert and his family by providing an annual scholarship to a student every year.

Robert Shannon graduated from Clinton High School in 1968 and was drafted and sent to Vietnam in 1969. On April 30, 1970, Robert received fatal injuries after subjecting himself to hostile fire as he rushed from his foxhole to trap the insurgents, keeping friendly casualties to a minimum. For his heroic actions Robert was posthumously awarded the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart, and Good Conduct Medal. Robert's siblings are, Theresa Shannon (MSCA) (deceased), Darlene Kuehl (MSCA 1953), Pat Judge (MSCA 1956) (deceased), Richard (SMHS 1958) (deceased), Mike, Edward and John (SMHS 1962).

The Clinton community lost a vibrant member on July 19, 2016, with the passing of Gary Herrity. Gary was a graduate of St. Mary's High School class of 1957 and went on to receive his bachelor and master's degrees from the University of Iowa. Gary dedicated more than 40 years of his life as a teacher and administrator in the Clinton schools. St. Mary's students from the early 1960s will remember that Gary was the coach of the SMHS 1963 state baseball championship team. As a young teen, Gary, like many, was thrilled to witness the success of the St. Mary's 1953 state basketball championship team. Recently, he was named an honorary member of that team when they met for a reunion. Gary was an avid historian on Clinton and Clinton County topics. He wrote over 500 articles which were published in the Clinton Herald. Even in his retirement years, Gary was active in preserving the historical importance of Clinton and the Catholic faith. Until the time of his death he was the chairman of the Catholic Historical Center at St. Boniface. Thank you to those who sent memorial gifts to honor his purposeful life.



Sr. Bertha Zeiser, OSF, passed away on June 14, 2016 at the age of 105. Sr. Bertha was born on February 25, 1911, in Browns, Iowa (near Preston). Bertha came to Mt. St. Clare Academy and was a boarding student there graduating in 1928. On July 7, 1929, she entered the congregation of the Sisters of St. Francis at Mt. St. Clare Convent. In 1929 she took the name of Sr. Mary Rupert and later took back her baptismal name. Sr. Bertha received her AA in 1931 and then went on to receive her BA and master's degree. For 33 years, she taught at the academy and served as principal for 14 years. After her "retirement" she began teaching English as a Second Language classes at Clinton Community College.

Our Church/School and Viet Nam Refugees

Prince of Peace Catholic School senior, Tony Nguyen, is the son of a Viet Nam refugee whose family was sponsored by a local parish. Forty-one years ago in 1975, the fall of Saigon created a wave of refugees fleeing Viet Nam. The United States took in 125,000 Vietnamese. Iowa was the first state to offer assistance to these refugees. Locally, churches sponsored several of the families. Tony's dad, Tom Nguyen was a seventeen year old young man who left his home in Viet Nam with his mother, younger brother, and two younger sisters to begin a new life in America. St. Irenaeus Parish, with Fr. James Lawrence as pastor, hosted the Nguyen family who came to this country with minimal English skills and very few possessions. Tom's father was a member of the Viet Nam navy and stayed on in their homeland until moving to the US in 1982.

Upon arriving in Clinton, Tom went to Clinton High School for a few months to develop his command of the English language. After that, he went to work since he was the main provider for his family. His younger siblings—Simon, Madalena, and Martha—attended North Catholic School and went to Mt. St. Clare for English. In 1976, the Nguyen family purchased the home they still live in today from Ray Horst. Tom's mother, Anna, is now 84 years old and lives with Tom, his wife Nhi, who he married in 1995 in Viet Nam, along with Tony and son, John, a student at Clinton public schools.

Tony has attended Prince of Peace Catholic School since kindergarten and will be graduating in May 2017. Tony serves Mass on Sundays and funerals. He participates in Quiz Bowl, is the Lighting Director for school plays, and helps at the scorers table during varsity games. Tony plans to attend college and major in some area of the medical field. Tony's childhood is very different than his father's childhood was in his war torn homeland.

Our Catholic community continues to support this family and many others by making a Catholic education affordable and possible. Over the years, Tony has been the recipient of scholarships and financial aid from the Prince of Peace School Foundation and the School Tuition Organization (STO).
